A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Families.

It's been another busy fortnight at Attadale with our Year 4-6 students returning victorious from the Interschool Cross Country event while everyone enjoyed a week of exciting Science Week activities. Well done and thank you to Mr Fritchley and Mrs Barnes for their efforts in bringing these events together.

In the coming weeks, Attadale families will be invited to participate in two important surveys. The first is the P&C Community Survey, which will be available via Google Forms. This survey gives parents and carers the opportunity to provide feedback on the P&C's operations as a community organisation that raises funds to support school initiatives and infrastructure, as well as providing recreational opportunities for students and families.

The second is the 2025 National School Opinion Survey (NSOS), which will be sent to all parents and carers via a single-use link delivered by email through Qualtrics. This survey, which some may be familiar with, is conducted every few years and includes mandated questions used at both school and system levels. The data helps gauge the community's views on key areas:

- · High-quality teaching and learning that leads to success for all students
- Providing a safe, engaging, and supportive learning environment
- Building strong, active partnerships with the community

Most questions use a 1–5 scale (Strongly Agree to Strongly Disagree), while the final two open-ended questions are particularly valuable for school analysis: What do we do well as a school, and what can we improve?

Attadale staff and students (Years 4–6) will complete a similar survey in the coming weeks. The admin team, in collaboration with staff and the School Board, will then analyse the results to identify themes and improvement targets as part of developing the 2026–2028 Business Plan, which sets the school's direction for the next three years and beyond.



It's important for as many parents and carers as possible to complete both surveys, while recognising the distinct roles of the P&C and the school to ensure feedback is directed appropriately. Both surveys are excellent opportunities for all community members to be heard and to help shape future priorities in our shared goal of delivering the best possible experience for everyone connected to Attadale. DEALING WITH AN ISSUE

At Attadale Primary School, as in every school or workplace, situations of conflict or concern occasionally occur. Our staff are highly skilled at supporting students with social issues and we regularly remind our parents of the appropriate lines of communication to follow if an issue arises involving your child.

While we take all concerns seriously, it's important for all of us to remember that we are dealing with young children. They are still learning how to regulate their emotions, behaviour and social skills and that is normal. Labelling of children, staff or parents through social media or gossip isn't fair; especially when all the facts are not established. It is of vital importance that if you have an issue, you make your child's teacher your first port of call. Often small issues can be 'nipped in the bud' and it is almost always beneficial to gain the perspective of the professional who works directly with your child.

Parents should never approach other caregivers or children with accusations or negativity. We have created this simple infographic to help you direct your questions to the correct person.
















Daffodil Day For all that Cancer takes, give us a hand.

FIRST AID FOCUS - ATTADALE PRIMARY SCHOOL

St John WA provides First Aid Focus, a free in-school program that allows WA students to learn basic first aid skills. This program offers fun, engaging and age-appropriate classes for all students ranging from kindy to year 6.

The Community Education Officers will be at our school in Term 3 Week 5 to spend time with all year groups (K-6) to demonstrate the correct first aid approach, as well as giving students the opportunity to practice and rehearse these life-saving skills. Please see below for further details.

If you do not wish for your child to be involved in this session, please let their classroom teacher know.



Kindergarten - Pre-primary

30 minutes Story time plus 30 minutes Ambulance visit

Through a storybook and with the aid of Kura the Bear, students will see how to identify an emergency, what number to call and understand the role of who can help in an emergency.



Year 1 & 2

45 minute to 1 hour (DRS of DRSABCD)

Students will learn how to recognise a <u>Danger</u>, how to get someone to <u>Respond accordingly</u> and when to <u>Send for help in an emergency</u>. At the end of the session students will be able to understand what an emergency is and how to recognise an ambulance and a paramedic.



Year 3 - 5

1 hour (DRSAB of DRSABCD)

This session is designed to provide opportunities to identify, practise and develop the student's skills. The focus for the students is to assess the casualties' condition, check their airways and breathing, and how to place the casualty into the recovery position.



Year 6

1 hour (DRSABCD) First Aid Action Plan

In this practical session students will build on their prior knowledge of the St John WA Action plan and learn how to treat a casualty who is unconscious and not breathing normally. The demonstrations will reinforce the message of staying safe and seeking help quickly in an emergency.
