A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Families.

Thank you to the 136 members of the community who participated in our 2025 Parent Opinion Survey over the last month. Your feedback is invaluable in helping us reflect, celebrate, and drive continued improvement. There's no surprise the school's connection with the community was the highest score (4.5, all scores out of 5). The strength of the Attadale community is known beyond our boundaries and should never be overlooked as a point of pride. Close behind were questions relating to students' sense of safety (4.4), most likely due to the care, capacity and approachability of school staff as shown in related questions (4.2 – 4.4). Areas with similar scores related to the quality of school grounds, the opportunities provided to students at APS and leadership (referring not just to the administration team but the numerous staff who go above and beyond in their projects). The positive comments section reinforced these scores with specific school initiatives or events highlighted as impactful opportunities for student growth, as well as the adults in the community and school staff as overwhelmingly positive influences in the lives of our students. The survey paints an incredibly positive picture of the school's current standing and is a testament to every member of staff, parent and student who belong to the Attadale community.

While there weren't any scores that could be described as 'low', several questions with aggregate scores in the 3.7 – 4.0 range provide some interesting lines of inquiry for future improvement. Given the high opinion of teaching staff in the broader questions, some questions relating to specific classroom practices such as feedback on learning and meeting the learning needs of students (3.8 and 3.7 respectively) speak to a potential lack of understanding in the community about what effective practice in these areas looks like on a daily level. As a school we can always improve the connection between home and the classroom by empowering families with the knowledge of not just which events are on the horizon but the specifics around upcoming learning. This investment equips parents with the knowledge and language to discuss and potentially help with their child's learning, if not just to get more than a "fine", "good" or even a grunt in response to the question, "How was school today?".

One question that consistently scores lower across all six opinion surveys I've reviewed at four other schools is around managing student behaviour. While improvement is always possible in both practice and awareness, two factors could potentially explain these lower scores:

- 1 negative behaviour is to be expected in schools as they're full of people training to be human beings. None of us are perfect and when we make a mistake, the restorative measures required should not be for public consumption or discussion. This means your children may witness an incident and believe no steps were taken to address it and make amends, however the school's approach is consistent and clear as outlined in our behaviour management policy which is available on our website.
- 2 the term often implies misbehaviour which is what some respondents may have had on their mind, but for staff it refers to all student actions and choices. School culture is shaped by the behaviours we highlight. If we focus only on negatives, that's what defines the culture. It's our responsibility, especially as school leaders, to ensure positive behaviours are recognised and celebrated. At Attadale, we're fortunate to have so many staff who do this exceptionally well, so keep a watchful eye out for these practices in your child's class and updates on our school policy in the future to continue to build awareness in the parent body.

Thank you again to everyone who responded to the opinion survey. The learnings and validations from it and the similar staff and student opinion surveys are a valuable contribution to the school's continued improvement and the development of its strategic direction.
